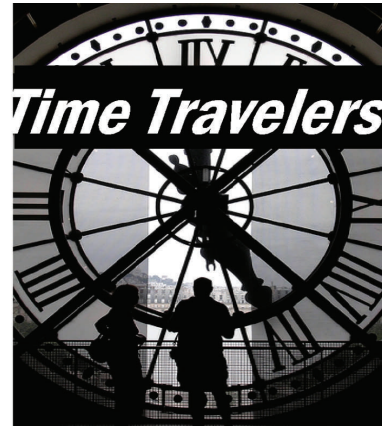


TIME TRAVELERS SUMMER BUS TRIPS

Spring into Summer~Antiques and Gardening in Princeton Wednesday, May 19, 2010 8:30 a.m.– 5:00 p.m.

Watching the daffodils bloom outside the museum has put me in a gardening frame of mind, so we'll start our bus tour season with a day of antiquing and gardening in quaint Princeton, Illinois. Our first stop will be the Sherwood Antiques Mall where, with over 200 dealers, I'm sure you'll be able to find something unique to gussy up your summerscape. I'll be looking for unique vases to display my fresh cut flowers and fun containers for my summer annuals! Then, it's off to downtown Princeton for lunch at the Garden Room Grill. Choose from Baked Mostocholli with marinara meat sauce, Chicken and Biscuits (think pot pie), or Stuffed Chicken Breast (stuffed with a pecan wild rice and drizzled with a mushroom sauce). Bonnie will have a dessert table too~need I say more!! If you get done eating early, visit one of the unique shops located on Main Street. After lunch, it's off to Hornbaker Gardens where you will find ANYTHING, and I mean ANYTHING, that you need for your garden from pots to plants. Although they initially specialized in Hostas, Hornbakers now carries irises, daylilies, ornamental grasses, trees, shrubs, aquatic plants, granite and pottery as well as perennials and annuals! A popular destination for gardeners throughout the Midwest, be sure to check out their website, www.hornbakergardens.com, before we leave to get an idea of what they sell. On their website, you will find 4 pages of annuals, 12 pages of hostas, and 26 pages of perennials!! Yes, I said 26 PAGES! Even if you don't garden, it's worth the trip. You can spend the afternoon casually strolling through the beautiful display gardens that are popular sites for wedding photos! The cost of this trip is \$48 for Museum Members and \$53 for non-members. The cost of the trip includes deluxe motor coach transportation, lunch and gratuity, and a driver tip. Cuneo Mansion and Gardens and Historic Long Grove

Wednesday, June 2, 2010 8:30 a.m.-5:00 p.m.

If you haven't visited the Cuneo Mansion and Gardens lately, now is a great time to do it. The mansion was built in 1918 in the Italianate style by Samuel Insull, an original founder of General Electric. It was landscaped by world-renowned landscape architect, Jens Jensen, who landscaped dozens of estates of the wealthy living on the North Shore as well as the estates of Henry and Edsel Ford. In 1937, John Cuneo Sr., owner and operator of Hawthorn Melody Farms Dairy, the National Tea Company, and the Cuneo Press, bought the home and raised his family there. The mansion opened to the public in 1991, and houses the Cuneo family collection of fine antiques, tapestries, sculptures, silver, porcelain, and paintings by famous artists including murals by John Mallin, the artist who painted the interiors of more than 100 Chicago churches. The Cuneo family recently donated the museum and gardens to Loyola University Chicago and will undergo renovations that will allow the university to utilize the facility in a variety of ways. We'll tour the gardens and have a box lunch in the mansion's Grand Hall~please choose one when registering: Overstuffed turkey, bacon and cheese on sourdough; Albacore tuna salad with lettuce and tomato on a multi-grain roll; or Shaved roast beef, smoky ham and cheddar on a French roll. All lunches include chips, a fresh-baked cookie and a beverage. We'll spend the afternoon leisurely taking in the sights in historic Long Grove Village. Make sure you stop by the Glunz Family Winery for a sampling~they know we're coming! I'm heading over to The Artistic Gardener to find treasures for my garden and then swinging by the Long Grove Apple Haus and Long Grove Confectionery for sweet treats to take home. Where will you go? The cost of the trip is \$52 for Museum Members and \$57 for non-members. The cost of the trip includes deluxe motor coach transportation, admission to the Cuneo Mansion and Garden, a box lunch, and a driver trip. This trip requires a great deal of walking, though there are places to sit at each venue. **Advance registration and payment is due by Monday, May 17, 2010.** Refunds cannot be issued after this date. Chicago Botanical Gardens~Twilight Tour and Music

Thursday, July 1, 2010 10:45 a.m.-9:30 p.m.

There's nothing better than listening to great music on a warm summer night with a glass of wine in a beautiful garden. So, we're going to do just that. Join us for a day of fun in the sun as we visit the Chicago Botanic Garden, a 385-acre Garden featuring 24 display gardens and 3 native habitats. We're leaving a little later than usual, 10:45 a.m., so we can enjoy what the Garden has to offer in the evening. When we arrive at the Botanical Garden, we'll have lunch on our own at the Garden Café. At 1:00, we'll board the Grand Tram for a 45-minute tour of the garden~a great way to plan your stops for the afternoon. Then, it's on your own until dinner. What garden will you explore? The Bonsai Collection? The Circle Garden (with its secret gardens, fountain, and annuals)? The English Walled Garden? Make sure you stop by the Gift Shop as all tour participants receive a 10% discount! We'll meet at 5:00 p.m. in the Fairchild Room for our luscious gourmet garden buffet which includes a traditional Caesar salad; grilled boneless chicken breast with a tarragon-champagne sauce, whipped Idaho potatoes and a sautéed seasonal vegetable medley; roasted vegetable pasta with seasonal vegetables and a tomato-basil sauce; bread and butter; New York-style cheesecake with triple-berry sauce, and iced tea and coffee. After dinner, we'll view the illumination of Evening Island before settling in for the "Hot Summer Nights" Music Series concert. We'll enjoy the music of Lesley Byers and the Jazz Cats as they play the music of Billie Holiday, Duke Ellington, Ella Fitzgerald and more. For those of you who want to exercise your dinner off, hop up and dance. Don't know how to swing or lindy hop? No problem, Big City Swing, a dance school in Chicago, will teach us how to swing and lindy hop! Light fare and beverages are available for purchase during the concert~including beer, wine, and margaritas. This might make getting up and dancing in front of strangers easier! You won't want to miss this trip! The cost of the trip is \$72 for Museum Members and \$77 for non-members, and includes deluxe motor coach transportation, the gourmet garden buffet, and a driver tip. Lunch is on your own at the Garden Café. There is a great deal of walking for this trip, but there are plenty of places to sit throughout the Garden.

Milwaukee: Karl Ratzsch's Restaurant and the Milwaukee Public Art Museum Friday, August 6, 2010 9:00 a.m.– 8:00/9:00 p.m. (traffic dependent)

A bus tour season wouldn't be complete without a trip to our favorite place, Milwaukee. This year, we'll start with lunch at the famous Karl Ratzsch's Restaurant. Ratzsch's, known for attention to detail, service, and quality food, was awarded the 2009 **Best German Restaurant in America Award** by VeryBestRestaurants.com. When registering, choose either the Sauerbraten (marinated sirloin roast with ginger snap gravy, red cabbage and potato dumplings) or the Chicken Schnitzel (breaded chicken breast with Natur sauce, steamed vegetables, and spatzle), each served with a house salad/dressing, Viennese Chocolate Torte, and coffee, tea or milk. I'm drooling right now!! After lunch, we'll drive a few blocks to the Milwaukee Public Art Museum to view its amazing collection and explore the architecture of the building. In existence since 1888, the Milwaukee Public Art Museum is known for its signature "wings," the Burke Brise Soleil, designed by Spanish architect, Santiago Calatrava, and perched atop the Museum's Quadracci Pavilion. The museum also boasts a world-class collection that includes 15th to 20th century European and 17th to 20th century American paintings, sculpture, prints, drawings, decorative arts, photographs and folk and self-taught art. It also holds one of the largest collections of one of my favorite artists, Wisconsin native, Georgia O'Keefe. The featured exhibit is **American Quilts: Selections from the Winterthur Collection**, a selection of 40 quilts from one of the world's finest collections of early American quilts (1760-1850). Before we leave, make sure you view the Cudahy Gardens and take in the expansive view of Lake Michigan from Windhover Hall. While in the Hall, stop by the Museum's gift shop as group tours receive a 10% discount. We'll view the closing of the "wings" at 5:00 before heading home. The cost of the tour is \$70 for Museum members and \$75 for non-members and includes deluxe motor coach transportation, lunch and gratuity, admission to the Museum, and a driver tip. **Advance registration and payment is due by Thursday, July 15.** Refunds cannot be issued after this date. **(I'll be on vacation from July 20-30).** Tour escort is Kim Shehorn.



How do I register for a Time Travelers Bus Trip?

How can I pay for the Time Travelers Bus Trip?

Payment for the trips may be made with cash, check, or credit card (VISA or MasterCard only). If paying by check, please make checks payable to JAHM. If you are registering for more than one trip, please write a separate check for each trip. **Payment must be received by the registration deadline to reserve your place on the trip.**

Refund Policy

Full refunds are issued for cancellations received **prior** to the registration deadline. Refunds are not issued for cancellations received after the registration deadline.

Photography Policy

Registrants and participants permit the Museum to take photos and videos of themselves or minor children during Museum programming for use as the Museum deems appropriate.

Liability Waivers

Participants must sign a liability waiver to participate in the Time Travelers Bus Trips. A waiver is included in this packet; you can also download one from the Museum's website, www.jolietmuseum.org, under the Time Traveler Bus Tours link. If you are registering for more than one bus trip, only one waiver is required for all of the trips.

Cancellation of Trips

Unless otherwise noted, a minimum of 35 participants is required for each trip. If the minimum is not met, the trip will be cancelled and refunds issued. You will be notified of the cancellation via mail or e-mail. Gather your traveling companions and register early to ensure that trips are not cancelled!
